

## T-Level Qualifications

- Design, Surveying & Planning
- 2 year course.
- Level 3 (A-Level equivalent)
- Full time educational setting
- Long work experience placement (9 weeks)
- Suitable for someone who isn't sure of what exactly they want to do
- Leads into further education opportunities

## Advanced Apprenticeships

- Surveying Technician
- Level 3 (A-Level equivalent)
- Day release at college for education
- Remainder of time at work on real projects
- Many employers sponsor apprenticeships
- Achieve AssocRICS
- Can lead to degree apprenticeship

## BTEC / HNC

- Construction and the Built Environment
- Level 4 qualification part time
- Leads to HND/degree pathway in a specific subject

## Degree Apprenticeships

- Work whilst studying
- Day release at university (BSc)
- 5 years to complete
- Offers the chance to become a Chartered Surveyor at the end (MRICS)
- Many employers sponsor apprenticeships

## Undergraduate

- BSc in Surveying - many options including Quantity Surveying, Building Surveying etc
- 3 years full time or 4 years with a year in industry
- Gain a role as a graduate surveyor on completion

## Postgraduate

- Want to study another degree?
- Opt to take a postgraduate degree in Surveying.
- 1 year full time / 2 year part time course
- Can be distance learning led and more flexible
- Option to work full time as a trainee whilst studying
